



Camp Mattatuck 2005

Troop 52 will attend Camp Mattatuck, Plymouth, the week of August 7-13. Your camp leadership: Paul Hoffman, Mike Vernovai, Jon Andrew, Tim Martin, Brad Hanover, Matt Downey, Oscar Bartlett and Joe LeClair.

The Scouts sleep on cots with mattresses in roomy 2-man wall tents. Meals are served family style in the dining hall.

The following forms are required:

1. "Youth Camp Health Examination Record. A Scout medical form, with physical examination completed after August 17, 2002 and signed by doctor and parent. Please send it in before July 31, 2005. If your form is on file with us, a parent must review it with a leader and sign it to verify its accuracy. If going to the doctor for sports or school, why not get a new form filled out? Any scout who brings over the counter or prescription medication to camp must specify the medication and provide a physician's signature in Section D of the med form. If the troop has the scout's current medical form on file and the scout is bringing any medication to camp, parents should contact the troop to obtain their scout's form for the physician's signature. Please note the specified over the counter medications provided by the camp, as needed (see Part B), for which only a parent signature is required.
2. Permission Slip attached
3. "COPE" Permission slip for older Scouts who are participating in the high ropes course.
4. Whitewater permission slip for any Scouts taking Whitewater Merit Badge

We'd like all medical forms in our possession by July 31st so they can be reviewed carefully.

Scouts must review the requirements for the badge(s) that they plan to work on at camp. Is there special clothing or equipment required? Is there some reading, writing, or drawing you can do before going to camp? *Be prepared.*

Sunday, August 7: We will meet at the pine grove near the parking lot at camp at 1:00 PM sharp. Please call Joe (860-283-4029) if you are going to be late.

- Have all your gear in a backpack protected from the weather.
- Wear complete Scout uniform (including troop hat, troop neckerchief, and brown or black shoes). You will wear this uniform at dinner each evening. All other times you are free to dress any way you like, except no tank tops, and wear sandals only in the shower. ***If you are missing a part of the uniform now please address the problem before arriving at camp.***
- Wear swim trunks under Scout shorts or have them readily accessible in pack.
- Have all medications labeled with your name and troop number. Medicine will be stored with the nurse in the health lodge.
- Parents are welcome to accompany the Scouts to the campsite to get settled in.

Saturday, August 13: Visitors welcome anytime after 2:00. Parents can bring picnic supper if they wish. No parents allowed in dining hall. If Scout is not eating supper in dining hall, note it on the attached (and be sure the Scout knows, too!). All parents should arrive no later than 7:30 PM. Best time to arrive is 5:00PM. You must have the Scout's gear in your car before the campfire.

2:00 PM Camp-wide Water Carnival (Boat and swim competition)

5:30 PM: All Scouts in campsite in full uniform for flag lowering and roll call.

6:00 PM: Dinner at Dining Hall.

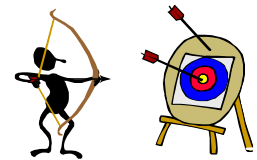
7:30 PM: Court of Honor at Dining Hall. All gear must be removed from campsite by this time.

8:00 PM: Campfire in amphitheater

9:15 PM (approx.): After campfire and torchlight parade, sign out with troop leaders in front of Tuttle Lodge (office), leave for home.

To write to Scouts during the week: Scout's Name, Troop 52, Camp Mattatuck, Mt. Tobe Road, Plymouth, CT 06782. **No packages will be accepted. Food and candy attract animals and are not to be brought to camp.**

If a Scout has to leave camp during the week, the parent must sign him out at the camp office, and the Scout must have a note from his Scoutmaster to confirm that the Scoutmaster knows he's leaving. If someone other than a parent is taking the boy from camp, that person must be listed on the permission slip signed by parent. When the boy returns to camp the parent or designated person must sign him in.
